## Themes featured at CCA's 2004 Africa Oil & Gas Forum

### GAS DEVELOPMENT AND COMMERCIALIZATION

*Discussion will address topics including requirements for building a successful gas business; how to build local demand; strategies for making an LNG project successful; challenges of new projects; evolving natural gas markets; and how to ensure long term supply chain for LNG contracts. Practical examples that address production in West Africa and delivery in North America will be discussed.*

### MARITIME SECURITY

*As of 1 July 2004, all seaports, terminal facilities, offshore platforms, and commercial maritime vessels of 500 GT were required to have met the security standards and practices set forth in the International Ship and Port Facility Security (ISPS) Code established by the UN's International Maritime Organization. In addition, the United States has established protocols to validate compliance with these international regulatory requirements. The discussion will focus on the regulatory compliance requirements, current and projected US transportation policy regarding oil and gas carriers, and an overview of the US Government's International Port Security Program (IPSP).*

### CORPORATE SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

*The idea of corporate social responsibility is gaining wide acceptance but there are still blurred lines on roles and responsibility between governments and the multinational oil companies. Expectations differ from country to country and discussions will try to lead to a better understanding and acceptance of these roles and responsibilities.*

### FINANCING AFRICAN OIL AND GAS INVESTMENTS IN SERVICE & DOWNSTREAM SECTORS

*It is difficult to secure credit in Africa. This workshop will focus on identifying which projects need financing and what it takes (requirements and documentation) to convince lending institutions to accept proposals. What obstacles are in the way of U.S. businesses interests who genuinely want to invest? Are there synergies for partnership with local companies?*


